

**LARGEST POETRY LESSON (MULTI VENUE)
GUINNESS WORLD RECORD TITLE ATTEMPT BY LAURA MUCHA
A SUMMARY OF GWR GUIDELINES FOR SCHOOLS**

Laura Mucha's lesson must last a minimum of 30 minutes. She must use a clear, recognisable start and finish signal.

The students in each school should take part in the lesson in an area of the school that is restricted and has clearly marked and controlled entrances and exits. The students must attend the lesson in a room designated for the largest poetry lesson title attempt.

In order to count towards the final total, each school must have a minimum attendance of 25 successful students / participants.

Stewards must disqualify any students / participants that are not present for the start of the lesson or leave the area in which it is taking place before it finishes. They must be accurately counted and deducted from the final total.

Each headteacher or deputy (or 'witness') must observe or carry out students/participants being counted in. Students should be counted in using a register.

Schools must take specific measures to ensure students / participants are not counted twice.

Each class teacher or 'steward' must be allocated a specific group of students / participants to observe during the attempt (e.g. their own class). Students / participants must be positioned in clearly delineated areas.

Neither 'stewards' (class teachers) nor 'witnesses' (headteachers or deputy headteachers) can participate in the record activity.

Each 'steward' (class teacher) and 'witness' (headteacher or deputy headteacher) must complete a steward / witness form.

Each school must upload the evidence required by Guinness World Records, namely:

- a 30 second video of students being counted as they come in, and
- the photo and 30 second video of them taking part.
